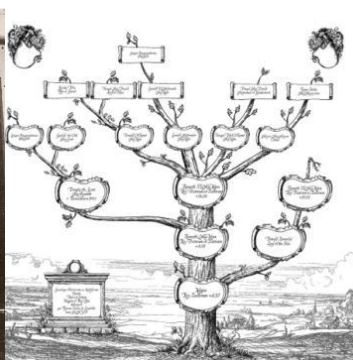


Research Collections

The African American Press Collection

1830 - Present

The title list for this collection was developed by an advisory board composed of key scholars. The collection includes 25 titles, the oldest of which are *Radical Abolitionist* (1855 - 1858) and *Principia* (1859 - 1864). This eclectic collection offers a rich store of information on African-American life encompassing issues such as history, social commentary, political advocacy, religion, education, literature and the arts among others. Black periodicals reflect the myriad of voices and perspectives of a people whose social history in America has been marked by the experiences of slavery, disfranchisement and achievement. Although many people are aware of the significance and popularity of *Ebony* magazine and may know of its founder, John H. Johnson, few know that Johnson's first successful publishing venture was *Negro Digest*. In 1942 Johnson got the idea that the assorted tidbits of information on Black people could be marketed and sold in the manner of the popular mainstream magazine, *Reader's Digest*. Thus, *Negro Digest* was born with the assistance of a \$500 loan secured by his mother's furniture as collateral. In 1970 the title was changed to *Black World*.

Johnson's second magazine, the aforementioned *Ebony*, debuted with the same size, look and feel of *Life* except African-American personalities, lifestyles and perspectives were the featured components. *Ebony*, began in 1945, just three years after he launched *Negro Digest*. This collection also contains a major *Ebony* competitor, *Sepia*, that ran from 1952 to 1982. A wealth of material specifically related to African-American history can be found in the *Negro History Bulletin*, founded in 1937 and published by the Association for the Study of Afro-American Life and History. In the areas of African-American literature, social commentary and political advocacy, this collection offers several important periodicals spanning much of the 20th century. Included among these are *Crisis*, *Opportunity*, and *Freedomways*. *Crisis* is the official magazine of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) and was founded in 1910. Its founding editor was W.E.B. Du Bois.

Perhaps with the exception of the NAACP, the National Urban League has been the most influential national organization championing the causes of Black America. *Opportunity* was the Urban League's official publication and was contemporaneous with the NAACP's *Crisis* from its founding in 1923 until its demise in 1949. *Opportunity* became a forum for the writings of Harlem Renaissance figures such as Countee Cullen, Claude McKay, Angelena Weld Grimke and Gwendolyn Bennett. James Weldon Johnson and Langston Hughes, both contributors to *Crisis*, also saw their work published in *Opportunity*. *Freedomways* was a quarterly literary and social commentary magazine focusing on civil rights issues and pan-Africanism. It began in 1961 and continued until 1985. Those who consult this collection primarily for sources in African-American literature and the arts will also find *Phylon Quarterly*, founded by W.E.B. DuBois and continued by Atlanta University, of interest. Other titles include *Black American Literature Forum*; *Black Theater*; and *The Black Perspective in Music*. The scholarly professional publications represented in the collection include some of the most important journals: *Journal of Negro Education*, *Journal of Negro History* and the *Journal of the National Medical Association*.

The Archives of Old Christ Church

1695 - 1976

The history of a social or cultural institution often provides researchers with a unique perspective on the development of a nation. Such is the case with the Archives of Old Christ Church, Philadelphia. This microfilm collection documents the history of Philadelphia's Old Christ Church, a cornerstone for the Protestant Episcopal Church in America. Researchers will be interested in the parallels between the growth of the church and its impact on the city of Philadelphia and the United States. Founded in 1695, Old Christ Church defined the plan for Episcopal Church Government after the American Revolution. It was also one of the first parishes to embrace the Sunday School movement - a phenomenon described in this catalog. (See The American Sunday School Union Papers, 1817-1915.) Among topics of research suggested by the minutes, registers, reports and personal papers in this collection are:

- The Anglican minority in William Penn's Quaker capital
- The Church of England's appointment of clergy to guide and instruct the congregation
- The lay power of the vestry vs. the aims of the early rectors
- The impact of Old Christ Church on Philadelphia, the American Revolution and the nation as a whole
- The influence exerted by prominent parishioners such as George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, Betsy Ross and Francis Hopkinson
- The Civil War and its toll on the Old Christ Church congregation
- The 1950 designation of Old Christ Church as a national shrine

This collection is also a valuable record for genealogists and local historians researching Pennsylvania and its history and was originally sponsored by the National Historical Publications and Records Commission.

1790 - 1950

Black Biographical Dictionaries, 1790-1950: Supplement provides on microfiche the full texts of 51 rare books containing biographical essays of African-American men and women from colonial times to the 20th century. Volumes for this project deal primarily with African Americans and contain at least one chapter or section devoted exclusively to biographical sketches. All volumes were published prior to 1951. After the publication of the original landmark Black Biographical Dictionaries, 1790-1950, additional titles were located. This supplement adds more rare and valuable biographical content to any African-American library collection. The Black Biographical Dictionaries, 1790-1950: Supplement titles portray a diverse commentary of historical and cultural events that shaped American history. Researchers can read accounts from black soldiers in the military (during the War of 1812, the Civil War and World War I) or research the history of religious denominations and business leaders in the African-American community. In addition, titles by early African-American publishers like R.L. Pendelton and the Hampton Institute are represented in this supplement. Titles include:

The 51 titles that were indexed here provided biographical information from a wide range of human endeavor. The names found here are often not mentioned in standard historical sources, but their lives and achievements are integral to any understanding of the black experience in America over the past two centuries. During a period when African Americans were denied public acknowledgement, biographical accounts were compiled and published within the community to document the ambitions and successes of its members. This index archive records the life and times of these 19th and 20th century Afro-Americans. This one volume index includes full name, birth and death dates, place of birth, occupation and religious affiliation for each individual, as well as the location of every biographical sketch and every photograph.

British & Irish Biographies

1840 - 1945

The only comprehensive reference work to the personalities of the Victorian age and the twentieth century to the Second World War - the most heavily researched 100 years in British history and a time when the biographical dictionary flourished as never before or since. The collection makes available 272 dictionaries in 1,200 volumes, published between 1840 and 1940 and containing biographies of contemporary personalities. It republishes both general works and specialist, professional and regional dictionaries. Many of the titles were originally issued in small editions and very few libraries have more than a small selection of them. The dictionaries are reproduced in their entirety, including plates, advertising and text additional to the biographical entries. The inclusion of complete dictionaries, particularly the regional ones, enables researchers to discover who was, and was not, included as well as to find a particular name. All volumes in a series are reproduced so that it is possible to see how the record of a person's life evolves - and how earlier information is sometimes later suppressed. British and Irish Biographies offers libraries the opportunity to acquire scarce material and to conserve existing holdings by reducing the need to refer to or copy the original volumes. It is available as a complete collection, in six parts, or individually by title.

Business and City Directories from Russia and the USSR

1892 - 1940

These directories offer a broad picture of Russian society in an age of dynamic social and economic change. As Russia's modernization accelerated toward the end of the 19th and beginning of the 20th centuries, social identities were in flux as peasants moved to urban areas to join the burgeoning industrial labor force; scions of the traditional nobility were selling their increasingly impoverished estates to become members of the nascent professional middle class; and government bureaucrats began filling positions in newly created government organs. The city and business directories capture these phenomena in a unique way by detailing these social and demographic changes of new Russia in a public, commercial medium. - **Ves Sankt-Peterburg (All St. Petersburg), 1892-1940**

For St. Petersburg, no volumes were published for 1918-1922 or for 1936-1938. The library's holdings are complete and also include the series Address Book of the City of St. Petersburg, 1892-1902. It was clearly the original on which the All Petersburgs were based. While not every person in St. Petersburg was listed, most were, including their professions. Furthermore, each volume includes an alphabetical index so one does not need to know the address in advance. Librarians, historians and demographers are likely to be familiar with Suvorin's directories, although, until now, virtually no library in the West has a complete run. All duplicate fiche are manufactured in the U.S. on silver halide film. Each volume lists houses according to districts and streets with names of owners and their professions. Local maps help bring the city to life for the researcher. The volumes also list all government offices and their employees. Searches for particular family lines or persons can be carried out using the last-name index, which also includes first name and patronymic.

- **Vsia Moskva (All Moscow), 1875-1917**

The collection covers 42 years and in most cases there is one volume per year (for 1895, 1896 and 1903 there are two volumes per year.) Nine of the volumes in the collection contain maps, with a total of 70 maps for 1903 and 1904 alone. These directories list names and addresses of all Moscow's inhabitants with their occupation and place of work; Lists of streets, with buildings and house-owners arranged by streets and police precincts; City plans, including special maps of theaters, circuses, etc; Lists of personnel in state, public and private institutions in Moscow; Churches and monasteries (with brief information on priests); Hospitals and personnel lists for each hospital; Practicing physicians arranged by specialization and location (street address); Lawyers, their assistants, architects and artists; and Factories, plants and companies in Moscow and its suburbs. The All Moscow directories are excellent genealogical resources for researchers, as well as for people trying to find information on family members who lived in the Russian Empire and later the Soviet Union. This collection is highly recommended for all libraries with Slavic, genealogy or general reference collections.

- **Vsia Rossiia (All Russia) & Ves SSSR (All USSR), 1895-1931**

Each volume contains lists of people who owned businesses - from large factories to small grocery stores - in cities and towns throughout the entire Russian Empire and later the Soviet Union. Some of the volumes are organized by guberniia, with general information about each guberniia in an introductory section, others by profession. Each volume includes a list of government officials and public institutions. The business directories, called Spravochnaia i adresnaia kniga (Reference and Address Book), combined with the city directories, are among the best genealogical sources for researchers, as well as for people trying to locate their families who lived in the Russian Empire and later the Soviet Union. As a large number of the names listed are Jewish, the directories should be of particular interest to Jewish families researching family origins. Each person is listed by his or her first name, last name and patronymic. There is a chapter for each guberniia. The first section of each chapter contains general information about the guberniia, including statistical data, names of the officials, etc. At the beginning of each directory, there is a list of government officials and public institutions for the whole country, including officials in foreign service. There is also a "Dictionary of Popular Practical Medicine and Hygiene." Most of the directories have advertisements for small businesses, which provide a vast amount of information about business practices of the time.

Calendars of Charters and Rolls in the Manuscript Collection of the Bodleian Library

1101 - 2000

Property deeds predominate, with manorial court rolls and accounts, but there are also many more personal documents like wills, inventories, marriage settlements, estate records and official papers such as commissions of appointment of sheriffs, deputy lieutenants and army officers and taxation records. Together these documents and bundles, some 35,000 in all, provide a mass of information on people and places all over the country. It has been the Library's standard practice to calendar and index charters and rolls as a group apart from other manuscript material. A calendar of those acquired before 1878 was published that year, but the many thousands of documents acquired since then have hitherto been accessible only through hand-written calendar slips and index cards, available only in the Bodleian Library. Publication of the calendar and index cards on microfiche, alongside the Library's working copy of the 1878 Calendar heavily corrected and annotated by W.D. Macray, reveals for the first time the wealth of documentation on local, social and economic history available in this under-used resource. Scholars can now carry out much preliminary research in their own libraries before consulting the documents themselves. Indeed for many research purposes sufficient information is contained in the calendars to make a visit to the Bodleian unnecessary.

Census Enumerators Return

1851

A national sample of the Enumerators' Returns compiled by Professor Michael Anderson, transcribed and published on microfiche to provide the most fundamental data ever published on the structure of mid-19th century British society at all levels. In 1851, the year of the first great national census, there were some 4 million households in Britain. Professor Anderson has taken a carefully balanced sample both of these households and institutions to produce detailed information on over 400,000 individuals including names, addresses, ages, relationships and occupations. An invaluable new resource for genealogists as well as social and local historians, the 1851 Census Enumerators' Returns contain crucial data for research into numerous aspects of 19th century family life, employment and institutions. The census data is readily accessible with entries for each household arranged by town, village or locality and a topographical index included in the printed guide.

Draper Manuscripts

The Draper Manuscripts, collected by Lyman C. Draper, contain first hand accounts from men and women involved in the emerging American frontier including Draper's own notes on his many interviews with Western pioneers and their descendants. Easily accessible through calendars and a printed guide, the biographies, oral histories and other documents provide important data on military figures, pioneers, Indian leaders and influential families as well as maps and genealogies useful to local and cultural historians. Among the biographical manuscripts are Daniel Boone's 1774 military account books and his Kentucky land survey notebooks, papers by and about the noted Mohawk chief, Joseph Brant, and the Campaign Leader, Thomas Sumter, together with accounts of frontier life from the diary of Thomas Spottswood Hinde. The regional manuscripts include the Frontier War Papers - original letters and journals kept by participants in the Indian wars in the West from 1754 to 1815 - the Kentucky Papers and the King's Mountain Papers assembled by Draper to mark the centenary of the victory of frontier troops over Loyalist soldiers at King's Mountain, South Carolina in 1780.

Eparkhial'nye vedomosti

1850 - 2000

Eparkhial'nye vedomosti were official publications of the Russian Orthodox Church, checked and sanctioned by authorities from the Holy Synod. Published in different Russian parishes in the second half of the 19th century and the beginning of the 20th century, the eparkhial'nye vedomosti appeared in magazine format and came out monthly or semimonthly. Like the gubernskie vedomosti, each eparkhial'nye vedomosti was divided into two parts, official and unofficial, with each part under separate editorship. In the official part of the eparkhial'nye vedomosti readers would find instructions from the Holy Synod and from local church authorities. The unofficial part contained such items as speeches, stories written by church representatives, and topics for sermons and lessons. One could also find articles on the history of the church district, information about temples and monasteries, news about the everyday life of the parish, biographies, obituaries and other information. These magazines are an invaluable source for research on religious literature and on the history of the Russian Orthodox Church, as well as for more general studies of Russian history. Gubernskie Vedomosti

1838 - 1920

The gubernskie vedomosti were pre-revolutionary local governmental newspapers published throughout the Russian Empire largely between 1838 and 1917 (although a few titles were issued through 1920.) The newspapers were also published in Ukraine, Belarus, Poland, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Moldova, countries of the Caucasus and Central Asia. The vedomosti were first published in 1838 in 42 cities by order of the tsar. By the beginning of the 20th century, more than 80 were being published. Sometimes the titles differed depending on whether they were oblastnye or voiskovye. Some were daily, other weekly, with print runs ranging from several hundred to several thousand copies. Each newspaper consisted of two sections: official and non-official. The official part published governors' orders and instructions, information on new taxes, court cases, etc. The non-official section was much larger, featuring a variety of information on current local events, plants and factories, sales and market prices, agriculture, transportation, the activity of specific societies, hospitals, educational institutions, libraries, etc. Educational articles on history, geography and economics were also included. In addition, everything from weather forecasts to advertisements could be found here including, on occasion, reprinted material such as diaries, archival documents, biographies and folklore. Although the non-official sections of these newspapers were originally apolitical, over the years editors began to introduce more and more political material, so that eventually they carried a great deal of information about political events.

Beginning in 1252, testaments disposing of real property in London and a variety of deeds, mainly conveyance of land, were noted by the clerks of the Court of Husting on parchment rolls. The resulting texts are a unique record of the shape and structure of the city from the 13th to the 15th century. Now conveniently accessible for the first time, the Husting Rolls allow researchers to trace the histories of individual properties and of streets, markets, and other features of the city. On January 7, 1765, in the middle of the Stamp Act controversy, Boston shopkeeper Harbottle Dorr took the current issue of the Boston Evening-Post and commented on its contents in the margins. Pinkasim

1854 - 1903

Pinkasim were record books of various Jewish organizations in a particular town or village. The organizations generally covered by pinkasim included prayer groups, study groups, burial societies, societies that helped the sick, synagogues and occasionally guilds associated with synagogues. The pinkasim, usually in the form of ledger books, contained such information as membership history and the by-laws or statutes of societies. The three pinkasim in this collection are among only a few of their kind surviving from Eastern Europe, making them extremely important research tools for genealogists. They contain beautiful illustrations, as well as finely-rendered calligraphy. The text is largely Hebrew, with some sections in Yiddish. The pinkasim were on display at the Jewish Museum in New York from the Fall of 1994 to the Spring of 1995, as part of an exhibit covering the treasures of the Ansky Expedition. From its beginnings in 1881 it has grown to be a major repository of important cultural artifacts of the former Jewish communities of Poland and the adjacent regions. It employs a polyglot staff and houses a museum, library and archive that hold rare print and photographic artifacts that recall a lost world of Jewish life and culture. The Institute is adjacent to the former site of Warsaw's largest synagogue, which was destroyed by the Nazis in May 1943 as a gesture of "victory" over the Warsaw Ghetto uprising.

Regimental Histories of the American Civil War

Fort Sumter . . . Bull Run . . . Antietam . . . Shiloh . . . Gettysburg . . . The men who fought these battles in Union and Confederate uniform left both a collective legacy and their own personal marks on American history. These Civil War soldiers bequeathed to posterity many traces of their lives and their military struggles in journals, remembrances and personal accounts.
