



Sample Searches: American Periodicals Series Online

1. You want to find a photograph of Alexander Graham Bell, inventor of the telephone.
 - Click the **Basic** tab to access this area.
 - Type “*Alexander Graham Bell*” (in quotation marks) into the field, then click the tab **More Search Options** (beneath date range limiters).
 - Using the pull-down menu for **Document type**, restrict your search to **Photograph**.
 - Click **Search**.
2. You want to find reviews of work by author Kate Chopin (1850-1904).
 - Click the **Basic** tab to access this area.
 - Type *Kate Chopin* into the search field, then click the tab **More Search Options** (beneath date range limiters).
 - Using the pull-down menu for **Document type**, restrict your search to **Review**.
 - Click **Search**.
3. You want to find a speech given by the Prince of Brunswick to Hessian troops in 1758; you know that a transcript of this speech was published in the *The New American Magazine*.
 - Click the **Publications** tab to access this area.
 - Type *New American Magazine* in the publication title field (if you’re unsure of the complete title, click the **Browse Publications** button next to the field to choose from a list of included titles).
 - Click **Search**.
 - Click on the publication title (*New American Magazine, The*). From the **Publication** page, type “*Prince of Brunswick*” (in quotation marks) into the **Search for articles within this publication** field.
 - Click **Search**.
4. You want to find recipes for rhubarb pie.
 - Click the **Basic** tab to access this area.
 - Type *rhubarb pie* into the search field, then click the tab **More Search Options** (beneath date range limiters).
 - Using the pull-down menu for **Document type**, restrict your search to **Recipe**.
 - Click **Search**.
5. You want to find various population statistics published during the late nineteenth century.
 - Click the **Basic** tab to access this area.
 - Type *population* into the search field.

- Using the **Date Range** limiter, enter the dates *1/1/1850* and *12/31/1899* in the **From:** and **To:** fields, respectively.
- Click the tab **More Search Options** (beneath date range limiters).
- Using the pull-down menu for **Document type**, restrict your search to **Statistics**.
- Click **Search**.
